## BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AND BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MEETINGS July 14, 2025

The Red Willow County Board of Commissioners and the Board of Equalization met in the Commissioners' Room in the courthouse on July 14, 2025. A notice of the meetings was published in the McCook Gazette and posted on the County's website. The combined agenda was e-mailed to each commissioner and the news media, uploaded on the County's website, and kept current and available to the public at the County Clerk's Office.

At 8:30 a.m. Chairman Ted Gans called the Board of Commissioners meeting to order with the following members present: Commissioners Ted Gans, Randy Dean and Charles Fritsche. Gans informed the public about the location of the posted Open Meetings Act.

A motion was made by Fritsche, seconded by Dean, to approve the agendas as presented. Roll call: Ayes: Gans, Dean, Fritsche.

The Board reviewed accounts payable and payroll claims.

At 9:05 a.m. Chairman Gans offered the floor for Citizens' Comments. No one was present.

The following correspondence was reviewed and placed on file: Summary of Insurance Renewal from NIRMA.

The Sheriff's, Clerk's and Clerk of District Court's Monthly Revenue Reports were reviewed and placed on file.

The Board of Equalization will meet at noon.

Calvin Chipperfield with McCook Concrete submitted a gravel bid for 40,000 tons of gravel for \$9.50 per ton. Gans explained the obstacles encountered when accepting gravel bids.

A motion was made by Dean, seconded by Fritsche, to reject all gravel bids for the 2025/2026 fiscal year. Roll Call: Ayes: Gans, Dean, Fritsche.

Health Director Brandy Bird joined the Board to discuss a school nurse contract with Southwest School District. She explained that some counties supply a school nurse to local schools to the benefit of both. Bird hired a part-time RN for the position. A motion was made by Dean, seconded by Fritsche, to provide school nurse service to Southwest School District. Roll Call: Ayes: Gans, Dean, Fritsche.

Bird also asked about a county vehicle for the Health Department. Dean will look into insurance issues if vaccinations are transported. Bird did include the cost of a vehicle in her current budget.

John Rundel with Southwest Weed Management joined the Board to request support for fiscal year 2025/2026. Most of their funding comes from the Nebraska Environmental Trust, however they are asking for individual county support. The Department of Agriculture did not award any grants this year due to budget restrictions.

A motion was made by Dean, seconded by Fritsche, to submit a letter of support, and to provide \$500.00 for the 2025/2026 fiscal year. Roll call: Ayes: Gans, Dean, Fritsche.

Donna Goad with Domestic Abuse/Sexual Assault Services was present to request support for fiscal year 2025/2026. They have experienced budget cuts along with everyone else.

A motion was made by Gans, seconded by Fritsche, to continue support in the amount of \$10,601.00 for the 2025/2026 fiscal year. Roll call: Ayes: Gans, Dean, Fritsche.

A motion was made by Dean, seconded by Fritsche to sign the Region II Agreement for the 2025/2026 fiscal year with a quarterly payment schedule. Roll call: Ayes: Gans, Dean, Fritsche.

The Board worked on the County's budget.

A motion was made by Fritsche, seconded by Dean, to approve the following items on the consent agenda: 1) minutes from the previous Board of Commissioners meeting, 2) accounts payable and payroll claims in the amount of \$520,290.65, 3) Resolution No. 1561, Repay General Fund 0100 from ARPA Fund 2580, 4) Roadway Occupancy Agreement for Century Link, 5) surplus items for Extension. 6) Tyler Technologies Renewal Agreement for VSO.
